The theme of the campaign *Pilgrims of Hope* has been inspired by the Catholic Jubilee Year 2025. The campaign is initiated by the ecumenical pilgrimage association PaxWalk and is intended as a continuous process over five years.



Saint Olav - 1000 years

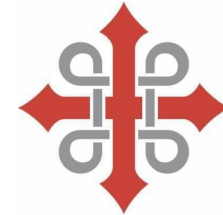
In the year 1030, Saint Olav died in Stiklestad. The cathedral in Nidaros, where he was buried, became the foremost pilgrimage destination in the Nordic countries. 1000 years later, we as pilgrims can draw inspiration from the Christian tradition that unites our Nordic countries.

Time for God's peace

This year, 2025, marks the commemoration of the ecumenical council in Nicaea in 325, as well as the Ecumenical Meeting in Stockholm in 1925. The theme that the Christian Ecumenical Council of Sweden has chosen for the celebration is *Time for God's peace*. That will also be this year's theme for the campaign *Pilgrims of Hope*.
